



## NMSA SUPPLY LIST FOR 2010-2011 ACADEMIC YEAR

### **GENERAL, For Use In All Classes:**

- 1 Package #2 pencils
- 1 Package pens (black)
- 2 three-subject spiral notebooks
- 1 Package Highlighters
- 1 black "Sharpie"
- 1 large eraser
- 2 glue sticks
- 1 compact stapler and box of staples
- 1 single hole puncher
- 1 pair scissors
- 1 12" ruler (cheap but solid)
- 1 Calculator (We suggest a scientific calculator, to be used for Chemistry, Physics, and all advanced math classes. The TI-84 is recommended. The cost is \$125.00, but will last the student throughout his or her time at NMSA and is required for ACT, SAT and AP examinations. Science and Math classes will each have one set of the TI-84 calculators in their classrooms should students choose to use those).
- 1 compass and 1 protractor with metric ruler (6 inch base, clear easily readable numbers, transparent, one-piece). **DO NOT GET A TWO-PIECE PROTRACTOR WITH A MOVEABLE ANGLE MEASURER.**
- 4 Gig USB Drive (\$9.00 at Office Depot)

### **ENGLISH DEPARTMENT:**

- 1 3-ring binder with dividers
- 150 pages of lined paper with 3 holes: for binder

### **SPANISH DEPARTMENT:**

- 1 binder
- 1 package of 7 tab dividers for binder
- 2 packages of 3x5 index cards (2 different colors)
- 1 notebook of art paper (thick paper without lines) with 3 holes: for binder
- 1 8 ½ x 11 sketch pad
- Pens (3 different colors)

### **HISTORY DEPARTMENT:**

- 1 spiral notebook: 150 pages. 8.5x11 for in-class writing.
- 1 3-ring binder
- 1 package of 7 tab dividers for binder
- 150 pages of lined paper with 3 holes: for binder
- 2 yellow markers

## **MATH DEPARTMENT:**

- 1 package Mechanical Pencils (cheap fine. Avoid really thin lead sizes; they break too easily).
- Refill lead for the mechanical pencils (make sure you get the right size!)
- Erasers for pencil work (good pink or art-gum erasers).
- Pens (one or two light colors that are visible to you: orange, red, bright yellow, silver, ...)
- Ruler (12 inch) – get a cheap, but solid one.
- Loose-leaf standard-size paper, college-ruled, lots (about 1000 sheets). NOT notebook clean-tear paper.
- 1 3-ring binder or large spiral notebook sufficient to a lot of notes (you will be writing a lot).
- One or two clipboards (get the ones with the small flat clip at the top). You only need one of these, but if you learn to use them, you will love them and want at least one other. Office Depot and OfficeMax have excellent CHEAP ones (Kmart is almost twice as expensive). The following links will show you the kinds of clipboard we recommend:
